

LETTER OF INTENT

FOR COOPERATION TO PROMOTE STUDIES OF INDONESIA AND THE INDONESIAN LANGUAGE

between

MINISTRY OF EDUCATION AND CULTURE OF THE REPUBLIC OF INDONESIA

and

UNIVERSITY OF EXETER, UK

Recognising the growing bilateral relationship between the Republic of Indonesia and the United Kingdom;

Desiring to promote cooperation in the field of education between the two countries, especially in developing programmes of teaching the Indonesian language in the United Kingdom;

Pursuant to the prevailing laws and regulations of the two countries;

Taking into account the Memorandum of Understanding between the Ministry of Education and Culture of the Republic of Indonesia and the Department of Business, Innovation and Skills of the United Kingdom on Cooperation in the Field of Education, signed in London on 28 May 2012;

Acknowledging our common interest to establish a long-term, mutually beneficial relationship;


The Ministry of Education and Culture of the Republic of Indonesia and the University of Exeter, United Kingdom, have the common intention to develop the following forms of cooperation on a non-binding basis:

1. Establish links between the two institutions;
2. Develop consultations between the two parties with the intention of establishing an Indonesian Studies Programme at the Institute of Arab and Islamic Studies, University of Exeter;
3. Explore possibilities for future cooperation, amongst other by introducing an Indonesian language course at the Institute of Arab and Islamic Studies, University of Exeter; and
4. Organise collaborative efforts towards joint academic programmes, research, teaching and publications.

Both parties will work together to develop specific agreement(s) on the points above which shall provide details appropriate to the possible establishment of an Indonesian Studies Programme at the Institute of Arab and Islamic Studies, University of Exeter.
