I am writing to you to extend my praise and thanks for the hard work, effort and determination that has been put into Westgate Hill's Indonesian dance troop by the University students and primarily Dewi Setiorini.

I am a year 5 class teacher at Westgate Hill Primary school and I have had the privilege to learn about, watch the children progress and generally enjoy watching the Saman dance. The pupils at the school started to learn parts of the Saman dance a year ago and have since performed at the Baltic, Westgate Hill Primary school and at Moorside Primary school.

The most recent performance was in October and was watched by over 200 adults and pupils. Some of the guests included Sir David Bell, prominent members of the community and parents of the pupils. Pupils from the school (ages from 6 to 11 years old), university students, Dewi and myself performed for the dance.

Pupils who perform the dance absolutely love learning and performing the dance. In fact they can quite often be spotted practicing the moves at home, in the playground and even in lessons! It has become so popular that half of the year group now know some of the moves, even if they have not been in the club. It has taught the pupils to be dedicated, work in a team and to respect other cultures.

This has been an outstanding club for the pupils to partake in and all the performances have received amazing reviews. Parents, governors, staff, parents and community members have thoroughly enjoyed watching the Saman performances and usually have to pick their jaw off the floor as they are so amazed at the talent the pupils show. Of course all of this would not be possible without the leadership and help of Dewi Setiorini and the university students.

This club will continue to run for the foreseeable future and will continue to show performances to many different audiences both at Westgate Primary and Moorside Primary school. The cultural opportunities the pupils (both taking part and watching) have gained are insurmountable and Westgate will always be grateful for this insight into Indonesian dance.
